- Survivor Group Counseling Program: free group counseling for survivors of domestic violence to learn about abuse in supportive environments, process their experiences of resistance and survival, and nurture their journeys towards healing and reconnection
- **Legal Assistance & Advocacy:** assistance in understanding restraining orders and legal education on the court process
- Court Preparation & Resourcing: provides emotional support for an upcoming hearing and assistance in identifying past history of domestic violence to amend a restraining order

Eligibility

- Categorical Requirement: Pregnant, breastfeeding, nonbreastfeeding postpartum women, infants and children up to age five who are found to be at nutritional risk
- Residential Requirement: Must live in the state in which you apply
- Income Requirement
 - Income standard: The state agency's income standard must fall under the federal poverty guidelines but cannot exceed 185 percent of the federal poverty income guidelines
 - Automatic Income Eligibility: Income-eligible for WIC based on their participation in certain programs. These participants include individuals eligible to receive SNAP benefits, Medicaid, or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
- Nutritional Risk Requirement: Applicants must be seen by a health professional to determine whether the individual is at nutrition risk.
 This is often done in the WIC clinic at no cost. The information needed can also be obtained from the applicant's physician
