The Association Between School-Based Physical Activity, Including Physical Education, and Academic Performance

Does classroom physical activity detract from academic achievement? Not according to this report, developed for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Across 50 studies, the research supports the positive relationship between school-based physical activity and academic performance.

Physical activity was broken down into physical education, recess, classroombased physical activity and extracurricular physical activities. Academic performance was reported as academic achievement, academic behavior and cognitive skills and attitudes. Across the 50 studies and a total of 251 associations, only 1.5% were negative!
