The 40-Hour training gives participants essential knowledge from which to launch and inform ethical and transformative advocacy work with survivor populations. The virtual training is open to all and is geared towards individuals or groups looking to volunteer or work with survivors of domestic violence at victim service agencies. SERVICE HIGHLIGHTS/UPDATES

ADV is proud to offer new therapeutic service offerings for youth & adult survivors of domestic violence & dating abuse.

Youth Empowerment Services (Y.E.P.):

Healthy Relationships for Teens (HRTs) Groups give teens & young adults a safe space to process relationship issues in a structured and supportive communal setting facilitated by licensed clinicians and antiviolence educators. Teens will



explore how to have healthy relationships with self, peers, and loved ones. The groups meet weekly with several weekday options, are confidential, and are open to teens ages 14+ of all genders, regardless of the gender of their dating partner.

Individual Therapy for Teens provides one-on-one support to teens looking for help in stabilizing emotional distress recovering from harmful relationship issues. Individual therapy focuses on each teen's unique goals and helps them to develop effective language, coping skills, and safety plans to combat the effects of abuse. Services are available on a case-by-case basis.

Survivor Group Counseling Program:

LGBTQIA+ THRIVE Group offers a

safe, liberated space for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, Asexual, & Pansexual (LGBTQIAP+) survivors of intimate partner violence to process experiences of abuse. The group is aimed at building self-esteem,



resilience, strategic resistance, and a sense of community, welcoming all regardless of the gender of their present partners. The group is offered weekly and virtually via secure ZOOM video calls at this time.

INTERESTED IN BECOMING AN ALLY?

The Bergen County Coordinated Community Response to Domestic & Sexual Violence (CCR-DSV) is a community network of individuals and organizations in the County that coordinates and supports collaborative efforts to reduce domestic and sexual violence, dating abuse, and coercive control. We accomplish this through awareness-raising, prevention, education, and advocacy.

The CCR-DSV recognizes violence as a critical community problem that poses significant threats to individuals, families, and the community. The CCR-DSV also recognizes that the power dynamics between the victim/survivor and perpetrator in domestic and sexual violence cases, when viewed through the lens of coercive control, calls for a specialized system of response.

No one individual or entity alone can end domestic violence which is why we are putting out a call to action for all of our community partners to join the Bergen County Coordinated Community Response Team.
