Directions

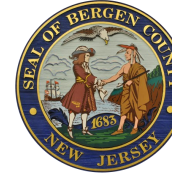
From Route 4 East or 4 West - Exit at Hackensack Avenue, Business District. Hackensack Avenue becomes River Street. From River Street make a right onto Kansas Street then right onto Hudson Street. Building is on your right. Turn right immediately after building into parking lot.

From Route 17 North - Exit at Polifly Road. Four lights later, make a right onto Essex Street, cross over railroad tracks. See Courthouse ahead. (Road curves and splits). Make a right onto Hudson Street and your first left between the Justice Center and One Bergen County Plaza.

From Route 17 South - Exit at Essex Street (Maywood - Paterson). Make a left at the stop sign onto Essex Street. Stay on Essex over Route 17, past Hackensack University Medical Center, over railroad tracks. Proceed as above from Route 17 North.

From Route 80 West or 80 East - Exit at #66 (Hudson Street, Hackensack, Little Ferry). Go to light. Make a left onto Hudson Street. As Hudson Street starts to curve, see Courthouse ahead. Make a right between Justice Center and One Bergen County Plaza.

This workshop is designed to introduce the topic of strangulation from medical, behavioral, forensic, and legal perspectives. Attendees will understand the heightened risk of fatality for victims who have been strangled, as well as the serious risks that stranglers pose to the general public. Attendees will also become knowledgeable about the psychological and physiological risks victims face following the act, such as posttraumatic stress, permanent brain damage, or delayed death. Attendees will learn to interview, screen, identify, and respond to victims and perpetrators who disclose or otherwise show probable signs of strangulation. Attendees will also be directed to leading resources that collect and disseminate state of the art research on the issue, such as the Training Institute on Strangulation Prevention.

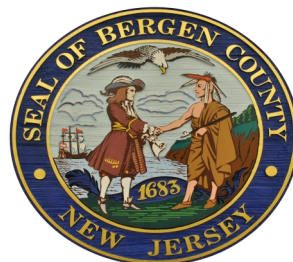
