Applicants selection

- On March 15, all applications will be put into a random selection, chosen applicants will be notified by email by April 2nd if you are chosen.
- If your application is selected and you have **previously** attended camp, you will be put on a waiting list until new children have been choosen.

The carpool list

- Children in same carpool list may have different counselors.

Medical conditions

- You will receive a letter with a link to medical forms for you and your doctor to fill out.
- Medical conditions do not affect your chances for the lottery as medical information is collected after the lottery process.



Ocelots ages 5 to 7



- Learn about the habitats and the basic needs of animals for survival.

Bobcats ages 8 to 10



- Learn how specific adaptations help animals survive in their habitats.
- Adaptations such as camouflage, eye placement, symbiosis, and many others will be discussed.

- How do humans "borrow" adaptations from animals.
- As habitats change so do the necessary adaptations need to change.

Red Wolves ages 11 to 13
